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Any school that operates the National School Lunch Program must also operate the School Breakfast Program starting in the 2020-2021 school year.

Schools with high percentages of free and reduced-priced students will need to have an Alternative Breakfast Model which is defined as breakfast service that takes place after the start of the instructional day.

A three year implementation plan for alternative breakfast models is determined by free and reduced percentages for public schools.

School Year 2020-21: schools that have 70% or more of their students that qualify for free and reduced meals.

School Year 2021-22: schools that have 50% or more of their students that qualify for free and reduced meals.

School Year 2022-23: schools that have 30% or more of their students that qualify for free and reduced meals.
